Stableford Scoring system

Participants chose prior to play if their score is to be used for handicapping.

Tee off 2.00 pm onwards

Play as many rounds as you like

Minimum 5 rounds to qualify for major prize

Best 5 rounds win, if a draw occurs, best 4 rounds, best 3 rounds and so on, from drawn competitors

Registration and Competition fee of \$5.00 per round to be completed in the Pro shop prior to play

Non-Members adult \$15 plus \$5 comp fee adding to a normal green fee price.

Non-Members junior \$8 plus \$5 comp fee adding to a normal green fee price.

Junior must turn 18 after April 1, 2016. Juniors still eligible for major prize

Registrations and fee can be arranged prior to the day for late starters

Score cards can be returned to Pro shop or bar prior to 12.00 the following day. No score card, No score.

Weekly winners to be announced (Must be 18 or over to collect alcoholic prizes)

No individual scores to be published until the after final round.

Players must have official golf handicap to win the major prize, runner-up or team prize.

Players without an official golf handicap will play off a maximum of 18. (1 shot per hole) To be monitored by Pro.

To claim weekly or NTP prizes, at least one member of the playing group must have an official golf handicap.

Scoring and handicap to be completed as if playing 18 holes. Only the relevant 9 holes score shall then be used.

Ladies play off red tee

Men play off the white tee

Teams to be nominated by the start of the eleventh round

### **Liquor Licensing Requirements – Responsible Serving of Alcohol**

- We reserve the right to limit the quantity of alcohol consumed by any particular guest without having to give a reason for such refusal;
- We reserve the right to stop the supply of alcohol to guests if it becomes apparent at any time (even prior to scheduled finish) that the guests are intoxicated;
- We reserve the right to close down the function if behaviour of guests becomes unacceptable;
- Guests who are intoxicated will not be served any alcohol and will be required to leave the premises;
- All guests are encouraged to ensure they have safe transport from the function;
- We reserve the right to confiscate any alcohol brought onto the premises without the prior consent of Management;
- Staff will offer to call a taxi for any guest(s) they consider should not be driving.
- We respect our Humevale neighbours and encourage our customers to leave the premises in a manner that does not disturb the amenity of the area.
